Other recognitions have been obtained by **Legambiente**, leading Italian institution for environmental protection.

Among the companies that pioneered the achievement of the **ISO 14000 Official Certification**, Segis is always devoted to ecology and concentrates its efforts to develop products specifically orientated to the growing target of "**eco-conscious**" consumers. Ecology is wholly respected in the workplace too, thanks to a strict control of emissions, environmental noise, ambience climate and to a differentiated waste salvage.

Most internal communication is made on telematic support, thus dramatically reducing the paper consumption. All production materials are **100% recyclable** and clearly marked for an easy identification, packaging is rationalized to ensure minimum material consumption, and regularly re-used. Most literature is printed on recycled and chlorine-free paper.

Product design and development is oriented to technical solutions, technologies and production processes allowing significant energy savings and lowest environmental impact. Segis products, however, are ecological even when, after a long and honoured service, they reach their lifecycle end: in fact they **can be fully recycled** in a simple and inexpensive way.

Surface finishing, glues and treatments are **non toxic**, tabletops finishes do not contain chromium, lead and their compounds and meet the **EU standard 89/109** for direct contact with food and beverages.

No Segis product is made, even indirectly, using children or illegal labour, all wooden elements come from plantation wood (**no primary forest material is used**).

Segis also bans the use of leather obtained by endangered animal species according to the **Washington Convention List**.
